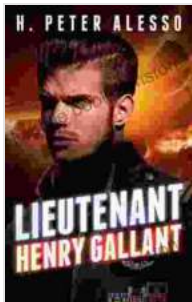


Lieutenant Henry Gallant: The Henry Gallant Saga

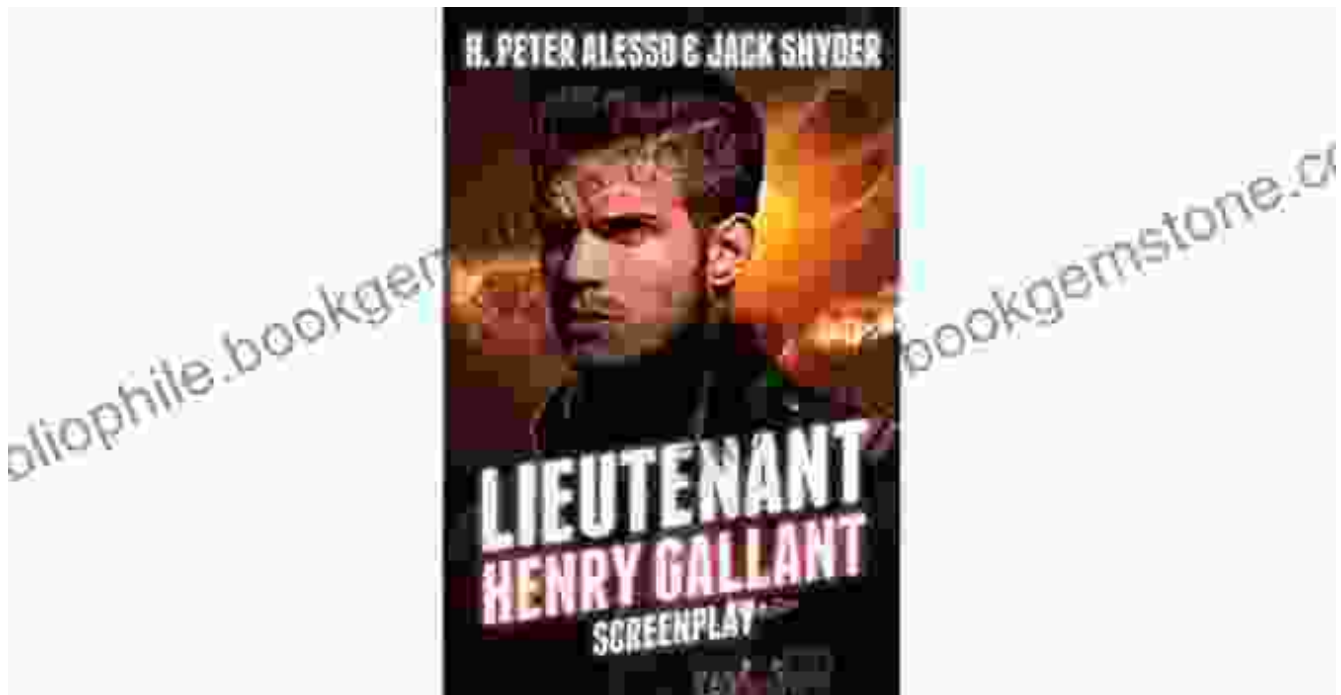
Legacy

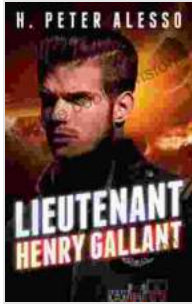

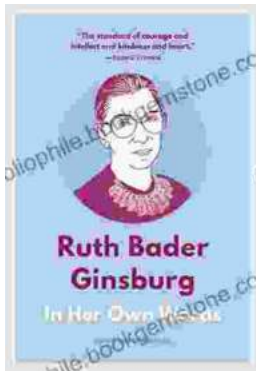

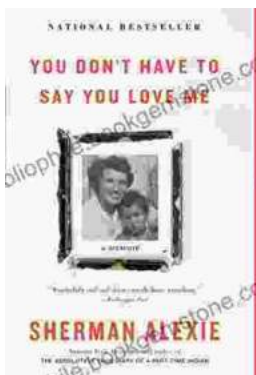
