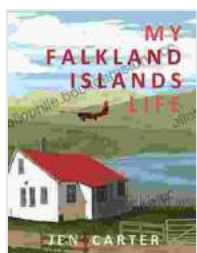


# One Family's Very British Adventure: Rediscovering the Joy of Family Travel in the UK

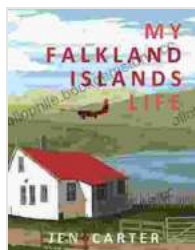

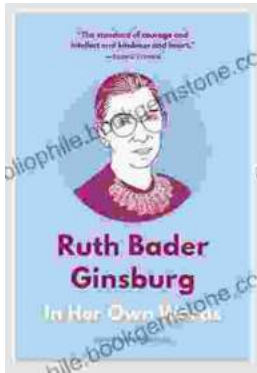

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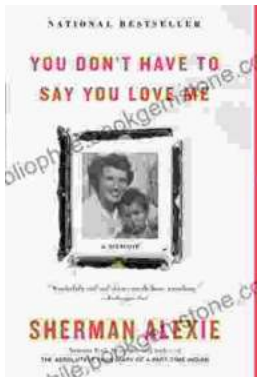
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
