

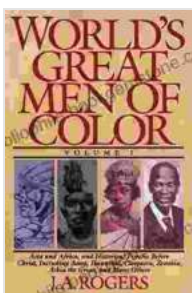

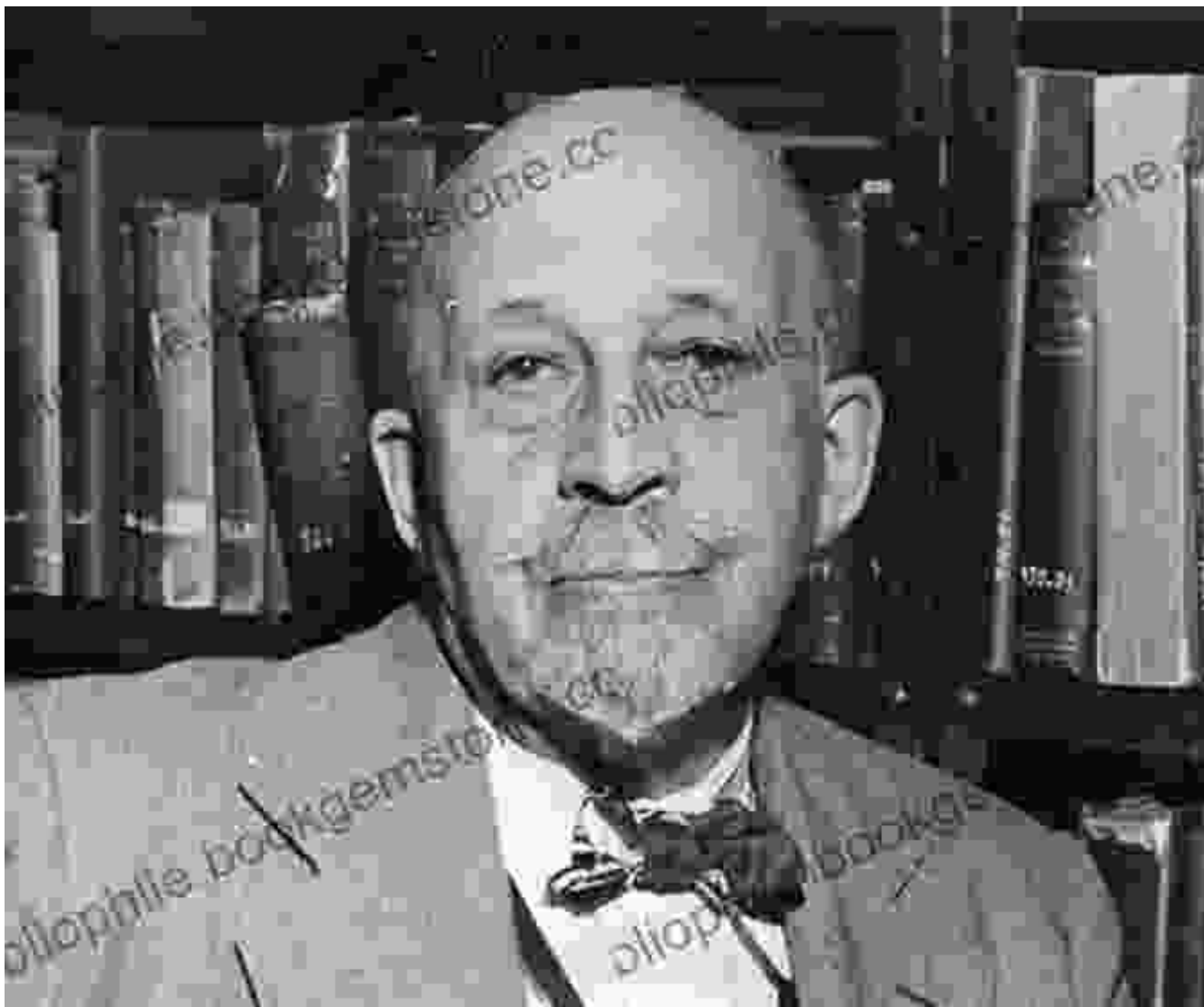

W.E.B. Du Bois (1868-1963)

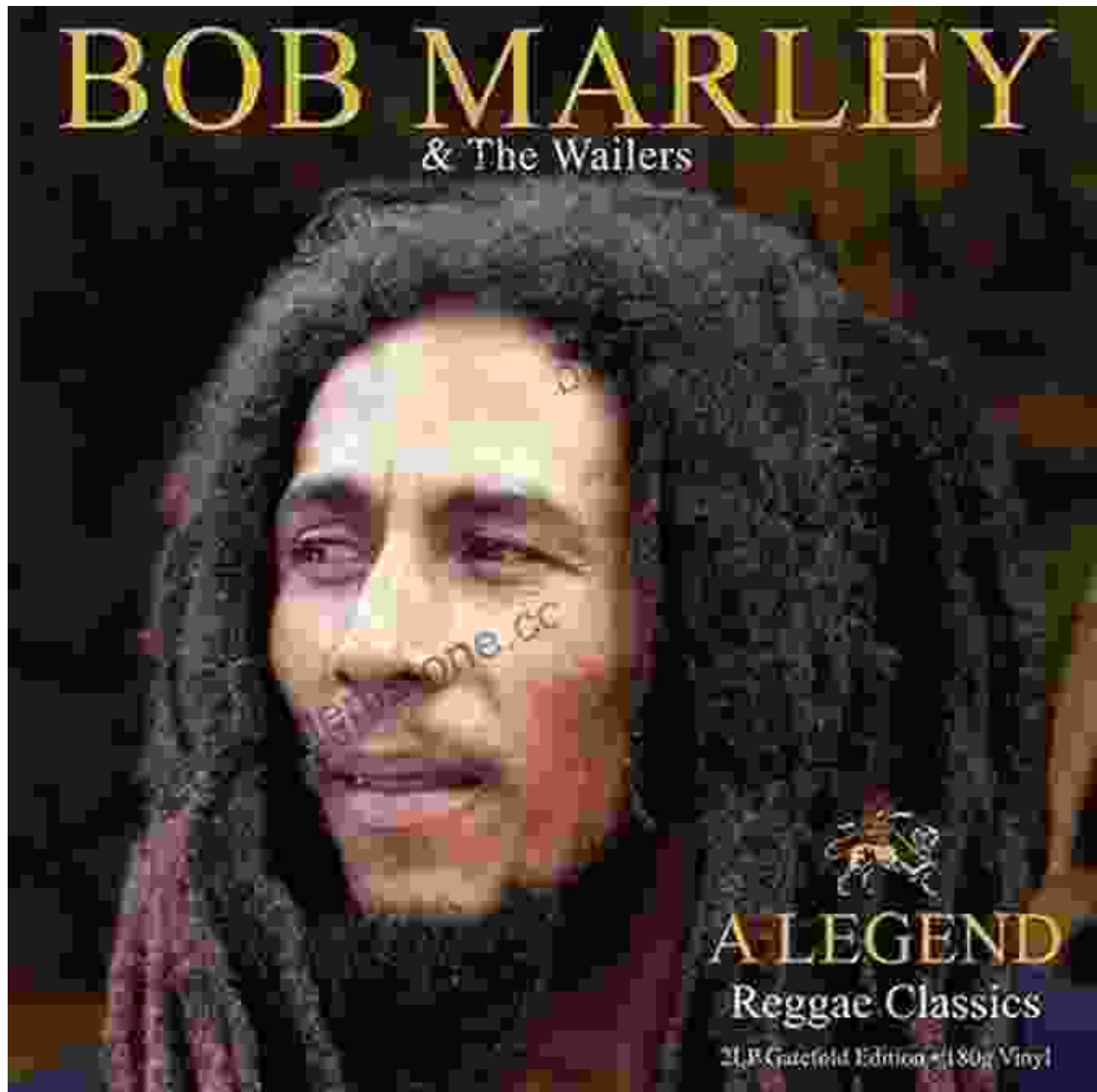
An American sociologist, historian, civil rights activist, and author, Du Bois was a leading figure in the Harlem Renaissance. His prolific writings,

Bob Marley, a reggae music legend

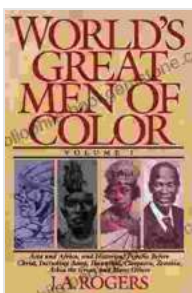

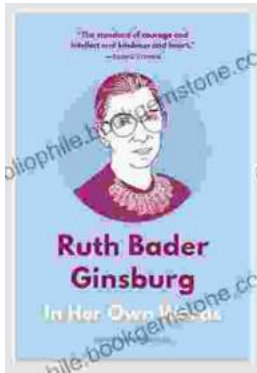

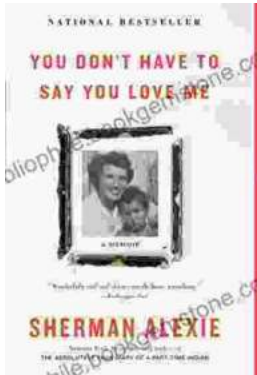
